✓ HVAC Technician – Installs and maintains heating, ventilation, and air conditioning systems
✓ Welder – Uses specialized equipment to join metal parts for construction and manufacturing
✓ Plumber – Installs and repairs pipes, water systems, and drainage systems

Skilled trades are in high demand, and many jobs offer strong wages without requiring a four-year degree!
