

Strategic Planning Approach and Tool

This worksheet supports teams in turning the STEM pathway concepts into practical next steps. It is designed to help partners identify shared objectives, assign responsibilities, and establish a timeline for progress. Use this tool when you are ready to move from planning to action.

How to use this worksheet:

1. Identify:

3. Facilitator
4. Plan Period – Timeline
5. Meeting Cadence
6. Identify 2–4 objectives on which your team wants to focus initially.
7. For each objective, identify the activities needed to support progress.
8. Assign roles and timelines based on partner strengths.
9. Define outputs (what will be created or completed) and outcomes (the intended impact).
10. Revisit this worksheet every 4–6 weeks to track progress and adjust as needed.
